



NLCB Policy on Temporary Licensure-TL01

A Policy Regarding the Licensure Requirements of Doctors of Chiropractic for the purpose of Temporary Practice

Intent

To set forth the requirements for temporary licensure of Chiropractors for the purpose of locum practice of duration less than 30 days in the province of NL.

Legislative Authority of NLCB

The Newfoundland and Labrador Chiropractic Board (NLCB) is given legislative power to determine the annual fees in relation to the licensing of chiropractors as outlined in Section 6(2) of the *Chiropractors Regulations, 1996* which states:

Annual fees

6. (1) Licences shall be issued for a period not exceeding 12 months.

(2) The annual fees for licensed members shall be determined and voted upon by the board at the annual general meeting.

(3) Each licensed member shall in each year on or before June 1 pay to the registrar the annual fee as determined under subsection (2) and if the member is otherwise in good standing, the registrar shall upon payment of the annual fee, issue a licence to the member.

(4) If a member fails to pay the required annual fee by July 1 in any practice year, he or she shall stand suspended.

(5) The board may reinstate an individual suspended under subsection (4) upon full payment of all arrears together with the annual fee for the practice year in which he or she is reinstated.

Description of policy

For the purpose of determining eligibility for temporary licensure the following guidelines shall apply.

Eligibility for temporary licensure

The NLCB may at their sole discretion consider an applicant eligible for temporary licensure in the event that they:

- Are currently licensed as a chiropractor and in good standing in a regulated Canadian jurisdiction
- Have completed and submitted the necessary application prescribed by the board indicating their intended practice location and intended dates of practice which shall not exceed 29 days
- Meet those other requirements as prescribed by the board

Fees

Where an applicant meets the eligibility requirements for temporary licensure, the applicant will be required to pay the following fees

Application Fee.....\$150

Licensure Fee.....\$75

Note: Temporary licensure (< 30 days per calendar year) will not require payment of the NLCB Registration fee (\$250). Applicants who apply for temporary licensure more than once in a calendar year will be required to pay a 1 time registration fee of \$250 and become a member of the Newfoundland and Labrador Chiropractic Association as per the Chiropractors regulations

This policy has an effective date of January 1, 2019. In the event of a conflict between the Chiropractic Act, 2009 or corresponding regulations and this policy, the Chiropractic Act, 2009 and regulations shall prevail.
